

Modified Register for Henry Bone

First Generation

1. Henry Bone was born on 2 Feb 1803 in Hayling Island, Hampshire, England. He died in 1892 in Martins Ferry, Belmont Co, OH. He was buried in 1892 in Highland Cemetery, Mt Pleasant, Jefferson Co, OH.

Henry was counted in a census in 1840 in Mt Pleasant, Jefferson Co, OH. He was employed as in 1860/1880 in Sail Maker & Rigger & Awning Maker. He joined religion in Methodist. He resided in 1880 in Martins Ferry, Belmont, Ohio, United States. England data states that Henry was born in 1805, but USA data shows variations between 1803 and 1805.

Henry, in early life was a sailor. He was at one time on a pirate ship, but I have no information as to the circumstances. While still a young man he came to America and located at Mt. Pleasant, Ohio. He had, earlier, learned sail making and after migrating, became an awning maker and part time Methodist preacher, living for some time in Martins Ferry, OH. Henry was much disturbed by the godlessness of a certain town (identity uncertain). He secured the use of an abandoned church and announced at the corner store that he would start meetings there that night. No one came. But he went through his meeting with singing, scripture and prayer without a congregation. Next day he was taunted with the question, "How many were at your meeting?" He answered, "Four." Next night the same followed by the same taunting question and his answer, "Four were present." The third night, some young fellows, curious to see who were there, came, became interested, and that began a religious awakening resulting in organizing a church. When asked, later, who were the four present on the first two nights, he said, "The Father, the Son and the Holy Ghost," besides himself (E.P.A.)

When Henry Bone was old he had become very deaf, but was faithful in church attendance. When he failed to hear something the minister said, he would call out in the middle of the sermon, "Brother, please sound that again." The preacher would stop and say, "Dear old Brother Bone didn't get that." Then he would repeat. (L.B.) For several years he had a summer cottage on the Moundville, W.Va. camp ground. His last letter was hardly readable and his daughter Ella Lytle had to finish it. He died in Martins Ferry. His wife was formerly Lena Yost, b.1817, d. 1898. In their home were three daughters and a son. per "Five Family History"

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Henry Bone in 12 Sept 1886 wrote from Martins Ferry, Ohio to Etta Hunt that he received a letter from sister Mary

In England reporting the death of her daughter Chalotte Ann .

5 F iv. Elizabeth Jennie Bone was born in 1847 in Mt Pleasant, Jefferson Co, OH. She died in 1872 in Belmont Co, Ohio. She was buried in 1872 in Highland Cemetery, Mt Pleasant, Jefferson Co, OH.

Elizabeth was counted in a census in 1850 in Mt Pleasant, Jefferson Co, OH. She was employed in 1870 in Sewing in Family

When 24 years old she was teacher of a Methodist Sunday School class. On a Sunday morning she ran up a hill to the Sunday School and fell dead from the effort.

6 F v. Martha Bone was born about 1848 in Mt Pleasant, Jefferson Co, OH. She died before 1860.

7 M vi. John H. Bone was born on 7 Oct 1852 in Belmont Co, Ohio. He died on 28 Feb 1871.

John was counted in a census in 1860 in Pease, Belmont Co, Ohio. He was employed as in 1870 in Sailmaker. He resided in 1860 in Pease, Belmont, Ohio.
